

Prosecutors ask to postpone status conference in Maduro, Cilia Flores case

What happened

On February 2, 2026, U.S. prosecutors asked Judge Alvin K. Hellerstein to adjourn the status conference, then set for March 17, 2026, to March 26, 2026 at 11:00 a.m. They also asked to exclude that period under the Speedy Trial Act. Counsel for both defendants consented to the request.

What it means

This is routine scheduling: it gives the government more time to produce discovery and the defense time to review it before deciding what pretrial motions to file. It does not change the trial date or reflect any finding on the defendants' guilt.

What happens next

The judge had to rule on the request; the docket shows the conference was moved to March 26, 2026 at 11:00 a.m.

Key passages from the filing (verbatim)

"The Government writes, with consent of the defense, to respectfully request (1) a brief adjournment of the next status conference, currently scheduled for March 17, 2026, to March 26, 2026 at 11:00 a.m."

Page 1 — Shows the request was joint and what date was proposed.
