

Judge approves postponing status conference to March 26

What happened

On February 2, 2026, Judge Alvin K. Hellerstein approved, in a handwritten endorsement on the government's own letter, adjourning the status conference to March 26, 2026 at 11:00 a.m. and excluding that period from the speedy-trial clock, "in the interest of justice."

What it means

This is the judge's formal approval of the joint request by prosecutors and defense for more time before the next conference. It is not a ruling on the merits of the case.

What happens next

The next status conference was set for March 26, 2026 at 11:00 a.m.

Key passages from the filing (verbatim)

"The Conf. is adjourned and time is excluded until March 26, 2026 at 11:00 a.m., in the interest of justice"

Page 1 — Is the judge's literal order resolving the request.
