

Prosecutors file revised proposed protective order on evidence

What happened

Prosecutors filed a letter to Judge Alvin K. Hellerstein responding to the court's April 7, 2026 order (Dkt. 303). It attaches an updated protective order, meaning the proposed rules on how the defense for Nicolás Maduro and Cilia Flores may use the evidence it receives.

What it means

This is a procedural step: the government proposes the text and the judge decides whether to sign it. The letter does not describe what changed from the earlier version.

What happens next

It is up to the judge to approve the order; the letter sets no other date.

Key passages from the filing (verbatim)

"requiring the Government to submit an updated protective order in accordance with the Order. An updated protective order is attached hereto as Exhibit A."

Page 1 — Explains why the letter was filed.
