

Prosecutors ask the judge to enter a revised protective order

What happened

The government asked Judge Hellerstein to enter a revised protective order (the rules for handling confidential evidence in the case). The new version adds a paragraph nine reflecting the defendants' consent to cross-production of certain electronically stored information. According to the letter, counsel for Nicolás Maduro and Cilia Flores consent to the addition.

What it means

It is a procedural step on evidence handling, agreed between the parties. It does not change the charges or the case dates.

What happens next

The letter sets no new dates.
