

A former federal prosecutor asks to withdraw as government counsel in the Saab case

What happened

Nadler states that he resigned his position as Assistant United States Attorney in September 2020, no longer works for the Department of Justice, and is in private practice. He therefore can no longer represent the United States in the case against Alex Nain Saab Moran and Alvaro Pulido Vargas.

What it means

This is a routine administrative step that does not change the charges or dates in the case.

What happens next

The document sets no new dates.

Key passages from the filing (verbatim)

"As of September 2020, I resigned my position as Assistant United States Attorney, and no longer work for the U.S. Department of Justice."

Page 1 — The stated reason for the withdrawal request.
