

Judge Scola grants ex-prosecutor Nadler's withdrawal; U.S. Attorney's Office continues

What happened

The order grants the motion of Michael B. Nadler, a former Assistant United States Attorney who represented the United States in this case. According to the docket, Nadler is withdrawn from the case as to Alex Nain Saab Moran and Alvaro Pulido Vargas. The order states that the United States will proceed with its current representation, the United States Attorney's Office.

What it means

This is a routine administrative step that does not change the charges or dates in the case.

What happens next

The document sets no new dates.

Key passages from the filing (verbatim)

"The United States of America will proceed with their current representation (i.e., the United States Attorney's Office)."

Page 1 — Who continues to represent the government.
